

American Heart Association CPR Certification Course

HeartSaver CPR is a classroom, video-based, instructor led course that teaches adult CPR and AED use, as well as how to relieve choking for an adult. This course teaches skills with American Heart Association's researchproven Practice-While-Watching technique, which allows instructors to observe the students, provide feedback and guide the students' learning of knowledge and skills.

This course is for anyone with limited or no medical training seeking a course completion card in CPR and AED use to meet job, regulatory, and/or other requirements.

The cost for this course is \$35, which includes a student study book and card*. The class takes approximately 3 hours to complete. All fees must be prepaid prior to the class date to confirm reservation. Please register early to reserve your space as class sizes are limited.

*Upon successful completion, students will receive an American Heart Association HeartSaver CPR, AED Course Completion Card that is valid for two years. When: Saturday, August 18, 2018 Where: Ashland Fire Station #2 Time: 9am-12pm Cost: \$35

Registration is first-come, first-served according to when class fees are paid. Classes are typically limited to 9 people.
