Nixel ~ the future of notifications

Public safety messaging continues to serve as an essential component in delivering public safety messages to community members quickly and efficiently. Ideally residents would have pre-subscribed to a local notification system allowing them to gain the firsthand information from their local source. Critical events can include severe weather-related events to actual earth-producing mass-scale damage to include earthquakes. A wide range of functionalities can be utilized to interface with the public including local radio emergency alerting, website information, smartphone apps, and registration platforms able to deliver information across numerous contact paths including voice and text.

Jackson and Josephine Counties have been encouraging residents to "Opt-in" to Citizen Alert. This delivery system is administered by Everbridge, a global leader for integrated critical event management solutions. The Everbridge platform allows account holders to sign up and receive alerts depending on their preferred methodology. This tool enables emergency response agencies to provide essential messaging immediately; thus with certainty residents are receiving the same messaging.

Internally, Everbridge has dynamic features allowing for two-way messaging to first responders, such as CERT, to utilize during disaster response and other events. Both internal and external applications provide the capability of sending hundreds of messages at once for the fastest information delivery.



The City of Ashland (COA) will soon change its internal platform to the Everbridge-owned Nixel platform. The Everbridge Nixel platform is similar with the exception of the ability to provide two-way messaging at first glance; however, the true benefits will not be known until the COA signs a contract and we begin training sessions on its use. CERT IMT folks responsible for Phone Trees can anticipate Nixel training.

Community members will continue to receive alerts through the Citizen Alert system; that will not change. Everyone should commit to a trusted method of receiving emergency updates. Whether you prefer local or national news the bottom line is to be informed through your preferred method. Be prepared when disaster strikes.

The Community Emergency Response Team Program

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program educates volunteers about disaster preparedness for the hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. CERT offers a consistent, nationwide approach to volunteer training and organization that professional responders can rely on during disaster situations, which allows them to focus on more complex tasks. Through CERT, the capabilities to prepare for, respond to and recover from disasters is built and enhanced.

At the same time, the CERT program was designed as a grassroots initiative and specifically structured so that the local and state program managers have the flexibility to form their programs in the way that best suits their communities. CERT volunteers are trained to respond safely, responsibly, and effectively to emergency situations, but they can also support their communities during non-emergency events as well. There are over 2,700 local CERT programs nationwide, with more than 600,000 individuals trained since CERT became a national program.

The CERT concept was developed and implemented by the Los Angeles City Fire Department in 1985. The Whittier Narrows earthquake in 1987 underscored the area-wide threat of a major disaster in California. Further, it confirmed the need for training civilians to meet their immediate needs. Since 1993 when this training was made available nationally by FEMA, communities in 28 states and Puerto Rico have conducted CERT training. FEMA supports CERT by conducting or sponsoring Train-the-Trainer and Program Manager courses for members of the fire, medical and emergency management community.

American Heart Association BLS Certification Course

Basic Life Support (BLS) is intended for Healthcare providers and other students seeking training and certification in CPR. This course teaches critical concepts of high quality CPR, use of an automated external defibrillator, and relief choking for victims of all ages.

The cost for this course is \$55, which includes a student study book and card*. The class takes approximately 5 hours to complete. All fees must be prepaid prior to the class date to confirm reservation. Please register early to reserve your space.

*Upon successful completion, students will receive an American Heart Association BLS Course Completion Card that is valid for two years. When: Saturday, June 9, 2018 Where: Ashland Fire Station 2 Time: 9am-2pm

Cost: \$55

Registration is first-come, first-served according to when class fees are paid. Classes are typically limited to 9 people.
